Melanie Hazim was the guest speaker for the meeting. Ms. Hazim is the Director of Outreach in the NJ Division of Consumer Affairs in the Attorney General's Office. Her remarks focused on scam and fraud awareness. The main priority of the Division is market protection. They license and register businesses, accept complaints from consumers and investigate businesses that receive complaints. The office also handles regulation of commercial weights and measures for the state. To avoid scams she reviewed best practices for answering the phone and reviewed the types of calls you may receive that are fraudulent. She reviewed email scams basically instructing members to not respond to email that asks you to take immediate action or asks you to buy gift cards and read the card numbers to them over the phone. She gave hints on how to recognize a phony email. Ms. Hazim will send Consumer Affairs publications and links to other information to Janet to post on the *Connections* web site. She also recommends the AARP website for complete information on scams.
